If you have a medical emergency or are in labor you have the right to receive within the capabilities of this facility's staff an appropriate medical screening examination, necessary stabilizing treatment (including treatment for an unborn child); And, if necessary, an appropriate transfer to another facility regardless of your ability to pay

This facility does not participate in the Medicare or Medicaid Program

Emergency care is defined as health care services provided in a freestanding emergency medical care facility to evaluate and stabilize a medical condition of a recent onset and severity, including severe pain, psychiatric disturbances, or symptoms of substance abuse, that would lead a prudent layperson possessing an average knowledge of medicine and health to believe that the person's condition, sickness, or injury is of such a nature that failure to get immediate medical care could result in: placing the person's health in serious jeopardy; serious impairment to bodily functions; serious dysfunction of a bodily organ or part; serious disfigurement; or in the case of a pregnant woman, serious jeopardy to the health of the woman or fetus.

The staff and healthcare providers of this facility have the duty to report in suspicion of abuse, neglect, exploitation, illegal conduct, unethical conduct or unprofessional conduct.
